Board of Education Purpose Board of Education Wrightstown Community School District

The Board of Education of the Wrightstown Community School District exists for the purpose of providing a system of free, public education for children in grades 4K - 12 and functions and abides under the laws and statutes of the State of Wisconsin.

As an elected seven (7) member board, it must employ a Superintendent, adopt missions and goals in conjunction with its vision, develop and approve policies, formulate budgets and set high instructional standards for students and staff.

Individual members of the Board do not possess the powers that reside in the Board itself. The Board speaks through its actions set forth through motions, resolutions, and other official actions taken at Board meetings and officially noted in the minutes and not through its individual members. An act is considered valid and official when approved at an official meeting by at least a majority vote of the members present or as otherwise may be required by law.

Additionally, the Board has its own structure and operating principles to give clear and precise guidance to their work. The Board shall always operate in a manner consistent with their Code of Ethics and with a focus on the District Vision, Mission, and Board Goals.
