
Student Achievement Board of Education Wrightstown Community School District

The primary responsibility of the Wrightstown Community School District is to achieve the vision of "*excellence in student achievement*" and the mission of a "*quality education for every student*."

The District views the interaction between student and teacher as the most important factor contributing to student achievement. Students learn best when there is a continuous challenge to achieve at higher levels and when instruction is differentiated to accommodate student academic, social, and emotion learning needs. Student and teacher interaction is supported by the curriculum being taught; the student achievement goals being set annually at the district, building and staff level; and the District policies and practices. The foundation for all student achievement is the District vision, mission, beliefs and student expectations.



Annually, the Board of Education will set specific measurable goals and objectives for student achievement. The goals will be data driven and support the intellectual, human and social, and career development of the students.

The Superintendent is responsible for regular evaluation of student achievement and progress; for monitoring District student achievement goals; and for regular reporting of such progress to the Board of Education and community.
