Virtual Learning Environment Board of Education Wrightstown Community School District

The primary responsibility of the Wrightstown Community School District is to achieve the vision of "excellence in student achievement" and the mission of a "quality education for every student." The District recognizes that there may be students who could need or benefit from a virtual learning environment to maintain academic progress or that unique situations may present themselves which would require a virtual learning environment for small or large groups of students over a short or long period of time. Virtual learning environments may take a variety of forms: full-time virtual learning, supplemental course offerings, short-term virtual learning, and blended learning opportunities.

The Wrightstown Community School District will determine the degree of curricular and instructional modifications within the virtual learning environment, the platform used for virtual leaning environments, the type of support services for a student, and the duration of access to a virtual learning environment. These determinations shall be made based on the individual student, individual student needs, or small or large group learning needs.

To maintain instructional momentum and academic progress, students are required to attend regularly, submit assignments and complete tasks as outlined by the instructor or course syllabus, and actively engage in the virtual learning environment. Students who fail to make progress in the virtual learning environment may be administratively removed from the platform and required to physically attend school in the Wrightstown Community School District.

The Wrightstown Community School District will work with families to maximize access and connectivity to technology through District-owned devices. Parents with students attending via a virtual learning platform are expected to support continued school relationships through communication with teachers and school administration, understand accountability for their children for attendance and completion of tasks, help their children prepared, on-time and ready to learn on the virtual platform, and provide a home learning environment that is conducive for learning.

Students attending the Wrightstown Community School District via a virtual learning platform must adhere to District policies and procedures as outlined in the Student Handbook related to code of conduct, academic integrity, grading, privacy, promotion, credits, graduation requirements, acceptable use of technology, and harassment and bullying.
