Academic and Career Planning Board of Education Wrightstown Community School District

The Wrightstown Community School District recognizes the importance and value of academic and career planning services (ACP) for students in grades 5-12. ACP is a student-driven, adult-supported process in which students create and cultivate a unique and information-based plan for post-secondary success, obtained through self-exploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills. The purpose of ACP services is to assist students with planning and preparing for opportunities after high school graduation.

ACP services will provide each student with assistance to develop and implement a personal academic and career plan; support in annually updating the academic and career plan; and access to ACP software that allows students to engage in career exploration, planning and preparation.

A <u>long-range district plan</u> for ACP services will be developed and annually reviewed by a team of school district staff and community stakeholders to assure strategic implementation of the '*Education for Employment with ACP*". The long range-plan will include:

- 1) analysis of local, regional, and state labor market needs;
- strategies to engage business, post-secondary education, and workforce development;
- 3) a description of ACP services offered to students in grades 5-12;
- 4) a description of Career and Technical Education courses offered;
- 5) professional development for staff to support the delivery of ACP programming and services; and
- 6) processes to engage parents regarding ACP services provided and opportunities to participate.

Annual progress of ACP goals and services will be reported to the Board of Education through policy and district goal-setting.
