## Smoking and Tobacco Use Board of Education Wrightstown Community School District

The Wrightstown Community School District strives to promote a safe and healthy environment for students, teachers, and district employees. In accordance with state law, Wis. Statutes 101.123(h) & 120.12(20), smoking, the use of electronic cigarettes, and the use of tobacco or other nicotine-containing products by students, employees and others is prohibited on premises owned or rented by or under the control of the board and in all vehicles owned or leased by the district. In addition, smoking, the use of electronic cigarettes, and the use of tobacco or other nicotine-containing products by students is prohibited while participating on or attending school-sponsored activities or events that take place off school premises (e.g. sporting events).

For the purposes of this policy, smokeless tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, electronic/vapor cigarettes, clove cigarettes, or other lighted smoking devices for burning tobacco, oils, or any other substances are prohibited. Electronic and vapor products including electronic hookah, heating elements, power sources, or any other electronic, chemical or mechanical means used to produce vapor that is inhaled by the user is prohibited.

Students who are observed violating this policy shall be disciplined according to provision in the student handbook and Co-Curricular Code. Employees who fail to abide by this policy shall be subject to progressive disciplinary measures.

Spectators or visitors who fail to abide by this policy shall be reminded by the principal, supervisor or his/her designee of the board's smoking and tobacco use policy. If a spectator or visitor refuses to stop smoking or using other nicotine-containing products, he/she shall be asked by the principal, supervisor or his/her designee to leave school premises.
