SCHEDULING FOR NEXT SCHOOL YEAR

We met with students in grades 9-11 prior to the holiday break to explain class requirements, introduce new classes, and explained the scheduling process for the 2024-2025 academic year. Students were given a course guide, course selection sheet, and instructions. Each student is expected to meet with an advisor to review their selected classes and obtain signatures from Math & Science teachers. A parent signature is also required. They were instructed to have these advisor meetings and the selection sheets returned to the advisor by Friday, January 5th so we can continue with the scheduling process.

Courses and the number of sections being offered are determined by the number of requests made by students. School staff, equipment, and supplies are based on the number of students requesting each course, so we would like students to choose courses wisely.

ATHLETIC/ACTIVITY REGISTRATION

If your child plans on participating in any athletics or activities offered during the school year, you will need to register them using this link: [Activity Registration Portal](#). Please be sure to choose the correct registration form. The student will need to complete the code of conduct portion along with you.

Your registration will allow the coaches to contact you. Without registration, your son/daughter will not be allowed to participate. The process will need to be done each school year using the same family account.

Returning User: Login to your family's account as a returning user, click "Register" to complete the steps and submit registration. The form will auto-populate the answers based on your previously submitted registration. Please review and edit the answers as needed.

New User: Parents/guardians will create a family account, register their son/daughter for their activity and complete the required steps. For WHS students, the Student ID is your child's 6-digit Skyward ID.

Physicals: Students registering for athletics must have a current physical exam form on file with us (uploaded to the activity portal) before the student is authorized to participate in tryouts/practice. If you are unable to upload the form, you can bring the form to school and we can upload it for you.

Bellin FastCare locations in Green Bay are currently offering sports physical walk ups for \$20. Please bring the [sports physical form](#) to be completed by the doctor. To ensure clearance for participation, physicals should be completed and uploaded to this account no later than 3 school days prior to the first day of practice/tryouts. A physical exam taken April 1 and after is valid for the following 2 school years; a physical exam taken before April 1 is valid only for the remainder of that school year and the following school year.

WORK PERMIT INFORMATION

As you may have heard, the Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights Division has developed a new online work permit application tool. The Division carefully considered the lessons of the past few years, when pandemic restrictions made it nearly impossible for some minors to obtain work permits and decided to pursue an online application that would be available to the parents of minors 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from any computer, tablet, smartphone, or similar device. The application improves accessibility for minors who live in rural or underserved areas and eliminates the difficult logistics involved in working parents having to take off work to make a trip to a work permit office.

Parents can access the site [using these instructions](#). Payment is made directly to the department through the application, using a credit or debit card or by ACH direct withdrawal. Once the permit application process is complete, the Department mails a paper copy of the permit directly to the employer.

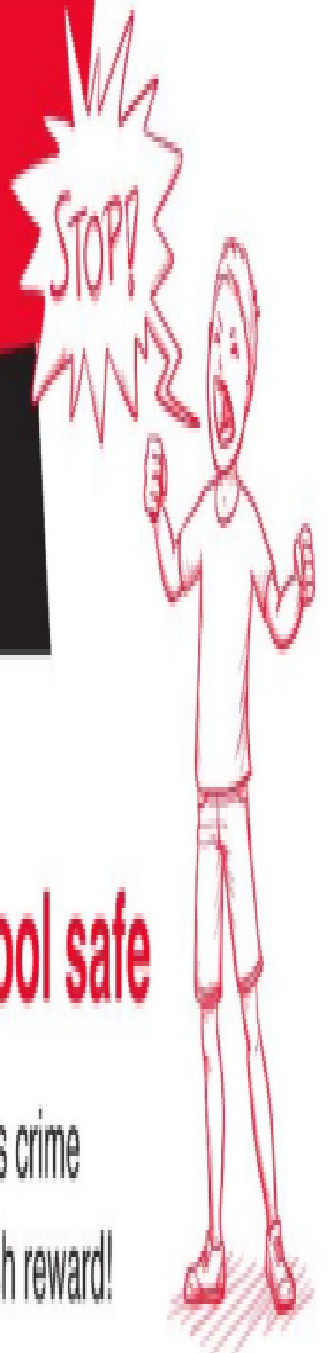
