ATHLETIC & ACTIVITY/CLUB REGISTRATION - IMPORTANT!!!!!!

If your child plans on participating in any **athletics** or **activities** offered during the school year, you will need to register them using this link: [Activity Registration Portal](#). The student will need to complete the code of conduct portion along with you.

Without registration, your son/daughter will not be allowed to participate. The process will need to be done each school year using the same family account.

Returning User: Login to your family's account as a returning user, click "Register" to complete the steps and submit registration. The form will auto-populate the answers based on your previously submitted registration. Please review and edit the answers as needed.

New User: Parents/guardians will create a family account, register their son/daughter for their activity and complete the required steps. For WHS students, the Student ID is your child's 6-digit Skyward ID.

Physicals: **Students registering for athletics must have a current physical exam form on file with us** (uploaded to the activity portal) before the student is authorized to participate in tryouts/practice. If you are unable to upload the form, you can bring the form to school and we can upload it for you.

Bellin FastCare locations in Green Bay are currently offering sports physical walk ups for \$20. Please bring the [sports physical form](#) to be completed by the doctor. To ensure clearance for participation, physicals should be completed and uploaded to this account no later than 3 school days prior to the first day of practice/tryouts. A physical exam taken April 1 and after is valid for the following 2 school years; a physical exam taken before April 1 is valid only for the remainder of that school year and the following school year.

WORK PERMIT INFORMATION

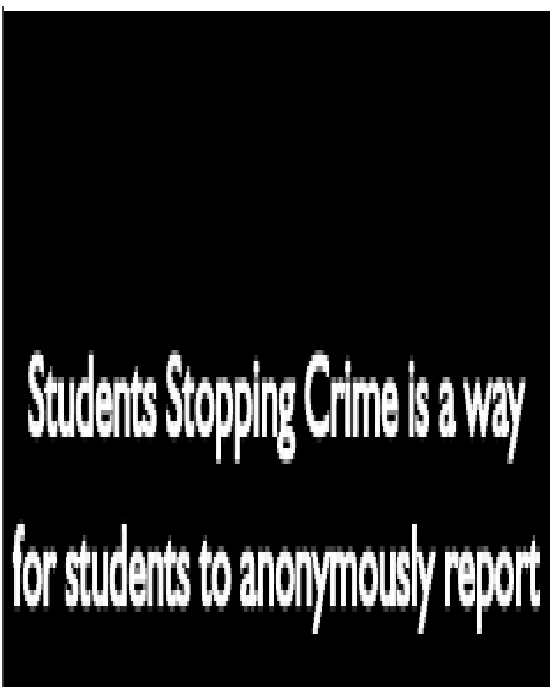
As you may have heard, the Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights Division has developed a new online work permit application tool. The Division carefully considered the lessons of the past few years, when pandemic restrictions made it nearly impossible for some minors to obtain work permits and decided to pursue an online application that would be available to the parents of minors 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from any computer, tablet, smartphone, or similar device. The application improves accessibility for minors who live in rural or underserved areas and eliminates the difficult logistics involved in working parents having to take off work to make a trip to a work permit office.

Parents can access the site **using these instructions**. Payment is made directly to the department through the application, using a credit or debit card or by ACH direct withdrawal. Once the permit application process is complete, the Department mails a paper copy of the permit directly to the employer.

School Health Services

Wrightstown Community School District

School health services provide the following services to our students: emergency first aid treatment, administration of prescription medication when needed at school, preventative care and education, and support for students with chronic health conditions in the daily management of their conditions. Wrightstown Community School District employs Health Aides to provide direct services to students at each building. Mrs. Amanda Denor is the WES Health Aide, and Mrs. Debbie Wishart is the WMS and WHS Health Aide. Mrs. Denor and Mrs. Wishart work with each building administrative assistant, supporting student health, assisting with medication administration, providing daily care, and collaborating on student health needs. Wrightstown Community School District has a partnership with Bellin for Mrs. Ashley Zeise, a Registered Nurse, to come into the district for approximately three hours per week to provide oversight, training, and support to staff.

How are School Health Services different from your Primary Care Physician and clinic?

School Health Services focus on keeping the students healthy and academically engaged; they cannot diagnose and treat student illnesses. When you visit your Primary Care Physician and local medical clinic, they aim to diagnose illnesses, intervene and plan for treatment, and manage long-term healthcare needs. School Health Services are not equipped or licensed to perform those services. Parents will be contacted for student health needs outside that scope of services. If your child has an injury outside of school or an illness is present, please seek out your Primary Care Physician to diagnose and treat.

How can I help my child perform at school?

One of the best examples you can provide to your child is to encourage healthy habits. Students cannot perform well when they do not feel good. Choose a bedtime that will give your child plenty of sleep, provide a healthy breakfast each morning, and support their physical activity. Encourage a healthy lifestyle, resiliency, and positive coping skills. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention also has some great resources for parents: <https://www.cdc.gov/parents/>

What does a School Health Aide do?

A School Health Aide provides emergency first aid treatment, administers prescription medication to students when necessary, and supports healthy students to perform their best. The School Health Aide works with school staff to facilitate screenings for students, communicates with parents about health needs, maintains school health records, and performs initial observations of sick or injured students. Our most important goal is promoting students to be healthy and academically engaged at school.

What does a Registered Nurse do?

Wrightstown Community School District partners with Bellin Health to provide Registered School Nurse services. Mrs. Ashley Zeise, the District Registered Nurse, will support the district three hours per week. A Registered Nurse develops emergency care plans, reviews and signs off on individual health plans and health-related 504 plans, and completes staff training in the district. Emergency care plans are for students with life-threatening health conditions, such as severe allergies to peanuts or bee stings, severe asthma, or students with diabetes. The Registered Nurse will work primarily with the school health aides and other staff regarding students' health in prevention and intervention.

Servicios de Salud Escolar

Distrito Escolar Comunitario de Wrightstown

Los servicios de salud escolar brindan los siguientes servicios a nuestros estudiantes: tratamiento de primeros auxilios de emergencia, administración de medicamentos recetados cuando sea necesario en la escuela, educación y atención preventiva, y apoyo a los estudiantes con condiciones de salud crónicas en el manejo diario de sus condiciones. El Distrito Escolar Comunitario de Wrightstown emplea asistentes de salud para brindar servicios directos a los estudiantes en cada edificio. La Sra. Amanda Denor es la asistente de salud de WES y la Sra. Debbie Wishart es la asistente de salud de WMS y WHS. La Sra. Denor y la Sra. Wishart trabajan con cada asistente administrativo del edificio, apoyando la salud de los estudiantes, ayudando con la administración de medicamentos, brindando cuidado diario y colaborando con las necesidades de salud de los estudiantes. El Distrito Escolar Comunitario de Wrightstown tiene una asociación con Bellin para que la Sra. Ashley Zeise, una enfermera registrada, venga al distrito durante aproximadamente tres horas por semana para brindar supervisión, entrenamiento y apoyo al personal.

¿En qué se diferencian los servicios de salud escolar de su médico de atención primaria y su clínica?

Los Servicios de Salud Escolar se enfocan en mantener a los estudiantes sanos y académicamente involucrados; no pueden diagnosticar ni tratar las enfermedades de los estudiantes. Cuando visita a su médico de atención primaria y a su clínica médica local, su objetivo es diagnosticar enfermedades, intervenir y planificar un tratamiento, y gestionar las necesidades de atención médica a largo plazo. Los Servicios de Salud Escolar no están equipados ni autorizados para realizar esos servicios. Se contactará a los padres para las necesidades de salud de los estudiantes fuera de ese alcance de servicios. Si su hijo tiene una lesión fuera de la escuela o tiene una enfermedad, busque a su médico de atención primaria para diagnosticarla y tratarla.

¿Cómo puedo ayudar a mi hijo a desempeñarse en la escuela?

Uno de los mejores ejemplos que puedes darle a su hijo es animar hábitos saludables. Los estudiantes no pueden desempeñarse bien cuando no se sienten bien. Elija una hora de acostarse que le permita a su hijo dormir lo suficiente, brindarle un desayuno saludable cada mañana y apoyar su actividad física. Fomentar un estilo de vida saludable, resiliencia y habilidades de afrontamiento positivas. ¿Qué hace un asistente de salud escolar?

Un asistente de salud escolar brinda tratamiento de primeros auxilios de emergencia, administra medicamentos recetados a los estudiantes cuando es necesario y apoya a los estudiantes sanos para que se desempeñen al máximo. El asistente de salud escolar trabaja con el personal de la escuela para facilitar las evaluaciones de los estudiantes, se comunica con los padres sobre las necesidades de salud, mantiene registros de salud escolares y realiza observaciones iniciales de los estudiantes enfermos o lesionados. Nuestro objetivo más importante es promover que los estudiantes estén saludables y comprometidos académicamente en la escuela.

¿Qué hace una enfermera registrada?

El Distrito Escolar Comunitario de Wrightstown se asocia con Bellin Health para brindar servicios de enfermería escolar registrada. La Sra. Ashley Zeise, la enfermera registrada del distrito, apoyará al distrito tres horas por semana. Una enfermera registrada desarrolla planes de atención de emergencia, revisa y aprueba planes de salud individuales y planes 504 relacionados con la salud, y completa entrenamiento del personal en el distrito. Los planes de atención de emergencia son para estudiantes con condiciones de salud potencialmente mortales, como alergias graves a cacahuates o picaduras de abeja, asma severo o estudiantes con diabetes. La enfermera registrada trabajará principalmente con los asistentes de salud de la escuela y otro personal con respecto a la salud de los estudiantes en prevención e intervención.
