WORK PERMIT INFORMATION

As you may have heard, the Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights Division has developed a new online work permit application tool. The Division carefully considered the lessons of the past few years, when pandemic restrictions made it nearly impossible for some minors to obtain work permits and decided to pursue an online application that would be available to the parents of minors 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from any computer, tablet, smartphone, or similar device. The application improves accessibility for minors who live in rural or underserved areas and eliminates the difficult logistics involved in working parents having to take off work to make a trip to a work permit office.

Parents can access the site **using these instructions**. Payment is made directly to the department through the application, using a credit or debit card or by ACH direct withdrawal. Once the permit application process is complete, the Department mails a paper copy of the permit directly to the employer.



YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP OVERVIEW

Youth Apprenticeship (YA) is a state-certified work-based learning program managed by the Department of Workforce Development. Available to high school juniors and seniors, YA offers a 1- or 2-year work-based learning experience, connecting students with local employers to build a strong future workforce. The program enables students to explore career interests, earn credit and wages, and gain valuable industry experience while working with career coaches and business mentors. Key components include:

- Mentorship: Students receive guidance from an experienced professional in their chosen field, along with career exploration support from a YA coordinator.
- Related Instruction: Participants are enrolled in coursework that complements their work experience.
- Work Hours: Students are required to complete a minimum of 450 work hours per year. Up to 200 hours of summer employment can count toward this requirement.
- Progress Reviews: Regular feedback on performance is provided by the assigned mentor.

Industry-Recognized Credential: Successful completion of the YA pathway awards students an industry-recognized credential from the Department of Workforce Development.

The Northeast Wisconsin Youth Apprenticeship Consortium (NEWYA) is a pioneering force in youth apprenticeship, providing comprehensive support to students at 28 high schools across our region. Committed to making Youth Apprenticeship accessible to all students by removing barriers through in-person support, NEWYA employs a multifaceted approach anchored by school-based Youth Apprenticeship coaches. By collaborating seamlessly with school counselors, career and technical education teachers, and local business and industry leaders, NEWYA offers a comprehensive framework that includes mentorship, related coursework, tracking of work hours, and ongoing evaluation of student performance. Through these collaborative efforts, NEWYA empowers students, fostering a well-rounded and impactful pathway to success.
